Changes to the Immigration Rules – leave to remain and indefinite leave to remain

From 3 April 2006 the following rule changes will take effect:

- Anyone entering the UK in an employment-related category, including those who have entered under a Work Permit or Ancestry category, must now legally reside in the UK for five years (currently four years) before they become eligible to apply for indefinite leave to remain (settlement).
- The initial grant of leave to remain will now be for a two year period (currently one year) followed by a further period of up to three years. This will benefit those who apply under the Highly Skilled Migrant Programme. However, Work Permit holders will still be eligible for leave to remain in line with the duration of their Work Permit.
- Those living in the UK as a Highly Skilled Migrant will now be able to count continuous time spent in the UK as a Work Permit holder, Highly Skilled Migrant and / or an Innovator when applying for indefinite leave to remain as a Highly Skilled Migrant.
- Those entering the UK under the Ancestry category will no longer be granted initial leave which would cover the qualifying period for indefinite leave to remain. Leave will now initially be granted for two years with a further period of three years.
